Ground School/Flight Academy

Our current ground school class is coming to a close and we are now we're assisting another cohort of high school students working to achieve their dreams of becoming aerospace

professionals. Those who excel will to qualify for the Tuskegee Airmen Flight Academy scholarship. We are happy to report that students are currently taking their discovery and orientation flights, which at this time, are being conducted almost every day Monday through Friday.

Rocketry Program

The after-school rocketry program meets on Thursday nights and has more than a dozen young students attending. They learn the aerodynamics of rockets, build model rockets and launch them. This is a great way to teach kids and get them excited about the art and science of aviation and aeronautical engineering. The Museum's drone club provides instruction to organizations and youth in the knowledge required to pass the FAA part 107 written exam. The Museum teaches youth to program and fly drones responsibly. Youth 16 years old and up can earn their FAA's UAS certificate and gain experience to be hired as a drone operator.
