The Tuskegee Airmen were the first African American military aviators in the U.S.





Armed Forces. Despite facing racial discrimination, they excelled in their missions, earning more than 150 Distinguished Flying Crosses. Their dedication paved the way for the desegregation of the U.S. military in 1948.

Curator's Corner The P-39 Airacobra Conservation Project



One of our most exciting conservation efforts is the ongoing restoration of a P-39 Airacobra discovered in 2023 near Oscoda, Michigan, on the shores of Lake Huron. This rare World War II aircraft, flown by Tuskegee Airman Frank H. Moody, is undergoing meticulous preservation by our team of historians, preservationists, and aviation experts. From the initial dives to its careful restoration, we are

dedicated to ensuring this incredible piece of history is preserved for future generations. We are documenting the process, hoping to include a time-lapse video, to capture the journey from conservation to stabilization. Stay tuned for an exclusive look behind the scenes!
